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PROFILE

I have over 27 years of work experience in Oil and Gas marine transportation, with particular expertise in leading diverse multi-cultural teams as a senior consultant on various marine assignments, including marine project management, assessment and application of current maritime regulations, development and implementation of safety management standards, and industry 'best practice' guidance.

An LLM in maritime law and Master Mariner's qualification (revalidated in 2020) combined with experience in various areas of the maritime sector, allows me to lead and contribute positively to diverse marine safety, assurance and operational matters. This has included developing / delivering complex risk management processes at PITL, OCIMF, BP Shipping, Lloyd's Register and onboard tankers.

I have led project teams to address specific operational matters, onboard multiple ship types (bulk carriers, oil/chemical/gas tankers, passenger vessels etc....), at marine terminals globally, and for ship owner / management companies.

I have seagoing experience onboard shuttle tankers (as a senior officer / master mariner) engaged in STS operations at FPSO's, offshore, sbm, cbm facilities across the globe.

As a senior marine advisor at Lloyd's register, I have hands on project management experience of developing and applying risk-based class rules for alternative design of offshore research vessels (DP3). I have led multi-cultural incident investigation teams in the marine environment (onboard vessels / oil terminals) for PITL and Lloyd's register. I have extensive experience in ascertaining and minimizing risk which may be encountered from various kinds of marine assets.

I bring together a unique combination of the highest level of marine qualifications in shipping and commercial risk management, as well as, a deep understanding of legal, operational risk, safety and project management issues.

The project team included multiple stakeholders from different teams at Lloyd's register and members from the Joint European research commission.

Risk based design evaluation of Large Lifeboats (270 persons) (2007-09) - As project manager, I provided support to the client in fulfilling requirements as stated under MSC / Circ. 1212 and 1238 which involved simulation of various Lifeboat Evacuation scenarios. Resources were drawn upon from LR EMEA (Hamburg), LDSS (passenger safety), London Oil and Gas, University of Greenwich.
